UNPRECEDENTED GROWTH



South West Sydney, and specifically Macarthur, is experiencing exponential population growth and development, and yet infrastructure is not being provided at a rate commensurate with growth. In fact, our region is quite simply bursting at the seams. Our roads are overly congested, our hospitals are at capacity, and our schools are overcrowded.

The new suburbs in my electorate, particularly within the Camden Local Government Area are virtually inaccessible by public transport, and yet state and federal Liberal National Governments are content with continually allowing development to occur.

In fact, by 2031 it is projected that the Camden LGA will experience growth of around 130%, with a further 30% of population growth projected for both the Campbelltown and Wollondilly LGAs. This growth has been predicted for some time, and the present and future needs of the South-West are continuously ignored.

Infrastructure cannot be retrofitted easily and successfully once development has occurred. The people living in the South-West, investing in our communities and often paying thousands of dollars in stamp duty to the State deserve to be given access to first-class public transport, roads, hospitals and schools.

PASSFIELD PARK UPDATE



I have continued my battle with the NSW Government to urgently address the shocking state of Passfield Park School in Minto.

As many Macarthur residents are now aware, the buildings on the school ground are no longer fit for purpose. The school is rife with mould and some parts of the school are shockingly inaccessible for many students.

Instead of receiving the work it requires, the school over the years has merely received touch-up jobs. Some visible mould has been removed from time to time, and minor paint jobs have been undertaken. But, from firsthand experience and exposure to the school, I can tell you that the

school needs much more than that to bring it up to an appropriate standard.

Time and time again, the concerns of our community have fallen on deaf ears.

The NSW Government has finally responded to my concerns about the school, conceding that they cannot ignore our community any longer. They have assured me that a "full upgrade" of the school is now in the early planning stages, and I will continue to advocate for this as a matter of urgency.

The students of this school deserve a first-class education in a firstclass facility, and I will not stop fighting until they get it!



NURSES AND MIDWIVES

It was my pleasure to join forces with the staff of Campbelltown Hospital at a rally in Park Central.

Staffing levels at Campbelltown Hospital have reached crisis point; particularly in maternity services.

There are presently 45 full-time equivalent vacancies at the

Hospital, and staff are rightly concerned about the hospital's ability to adequately care for and service our growing community.

Hospital staff are having to work harder than ever to meet up this shortfall in staff.

I've penned an open letter to the NSW Health Minister and outlined the steps that I believe the Liberal Government should take to address this crisis.

As a former employee, and present volunteer at the hospital, I will continue to fight to ensure that our Hospital is adequately resourced.

Thank you to the NSW Nurses and Midwives' Association for their advocacy on this issue.

RAISE THE RATE

Social security exists to provide support to some of the most vulnerable people in our society. Time and time again, people accessing our social security have been vilified and made to feel like criminals by the current Government.

I firmly believe that Newstart is too low - \$40 a day is not enough to live on, especially considering the rising cost of living.

That is why I have been championing this issue to raise Newstart. It has been clear to me for some time that the current

rate of Newstart is so low that it is stopping people from getting work.

I have met with numerous local residents who are wishing to find work, many of whom are in the later stages of their working lives and relying on Centrelink for the first time - these people are struggling to pay for rent, electricity, servicing mortgages and to put food on the table for their families.

The Treasurer himself has conceded that raising Newstart would be good for our floundering economy – it is time that we get this done.
